July 1, 1908, and is under the direction of an Executive Committee of thirty-nine Christian laymen, fourteen of whom reside in Knoxville, Tenn., the headquarters, and the other twenty-five are distributed throughout all the States of the Convention. This Committee has had only one paid Secretary during all these years.

The following are some of the activities in which it is engaged:

First, it has done much to promote weekly offerings and is still quite active in promoting the thorough every member canvass and Scriptural giving. This is done by offering suggestions through correspondence, by the use of literature, and by the personal efforts of the General Secretary. In some associations zealous pastors and laymen are conducting the Every Member Canvass in all their churches. The Committee has three pieces of literature on this subject which will be furnished on application.

Second, the movement is helping to organize Men's Missionary Unions in a number of the leading churches. A Constitution and By-Laws for such an organization will be furnished to any who are interested. It is also suggested that the Baptist churches of a city organize a city union to meet quarterly for comparing notes, cultivating fellowship, and promoting intelligence.

Third, the Laymen's Missionary Movement is zealous in promoting the Bible doctrine of stewardship among laymen; this work is done through the distribution of tracts and by addresses delivered in the churches and at conventions and banquets of men. Hundreds of prosperous laymen have been induced to adopt the tenth as the minimum standard in giving.

Fourth, much has been accomplished in arousing men to more active service and more generous giving through Conventions—district, State, and general.

Fifth, in many associations the Laymen's Committee is helping to conduct missionary rallies and to organize campaigns in the interest both of evangelism and enlistment.

Sixth, the Executive Committee is now engaged in an effort to secure ten thousand emergency men among Southern Baptists, each of whom agrees to contribute once a year as much as five dollars to relieve some worthy and needy enterprise that the boards are unable to help. While considerable success has already been achieved in this cause, it has been decided to make the week beginning February 3, 1918, Emergency Week. It is hoped that all the leading churches, that have not already done so, will present this matter to their men during that week. Literature and cards will be furnished.

The movement has been of some value in promoting more generous support of the Boards. Since it began in 1908 the offerings of Southern Baptists to Home and Foreign Missions have advanced from \$668,223.39 to \$1,436,762.48. A few Southern Baptist men are now supporting several missionaries.

REPORT OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

The Executive Committee held two meetings at Orangeburg since our last Association.

At the first meeting and in accordance with instructions from the Association, the apportionment to the churches was made and delivered to the Clerk of the Association to be printed in the Minutes. As the churches did not know how much to send for Minutes and as the fund has most always been too small, the Minutes have necessarily been delayed, so the Executive Committee apportioned each church a certain amount to be sent up for Minutes. If these apportionments are met in full we shall have our Minutes promptly. No church to receive Minutes unless they contributed to the printing.

At the second meeting applications were received for State Mission aid. Only one church in the Association made application. This application was left in the hands of a committee of three with power to act.

The report of this committee is attached hereto as a part of this report.

REPORT UPON SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

In making a report any one is apt to be influenced by their own observations, and as it is impossible to attend all the Sunday Schools in order to make a report of conditions first hand, your committee has seen fit to consult the most available statistics of Sunday School work in the Association. Doing so, we find that the percentage of average attendance to enrollment is less than 60 per cent—a percentage entirely too low for efficient Sunday School work, for attendance is often the barometer of interest. Certain it is that the average class of 10 with four absent every Sunday can not do the work it should. The Good Shepherd left the ninety and nine sheep to seek the lost one. What are our Sunday Schools going to do with the 40 out of 100 absent members every Sunday in the year? We find some consolation, however, that there has been some increase in the average attendance the past year.

We also note that about 40 per cent. of our church members are in our Sunday Schools, with but a slight increase during the past year. If, as has been said, the Sunday School is the life of the church, it would seem that our churches are only about 40 per cent. alive. This condition should not be, and we recommend that the pastors of the Association bring this fact before the members of their churches who are not working in the Sunday Schools.

We find that there has been a decided increase in the use of graded literature in our Sunday Schools. We consider this a sign of progress, and would ask that the remainder of the schools adopt this literature. Even if it were not better, a change will often help. By all means strive to make the Sunday School interesting. Give the graded literature a trial. Put up a banner to instill rivalry between the classes. The Bible is the most interesting of books. Let it be taught in an interesting and consecrated manner and many of the Sunday School problems will vanish.
