2. That no salary be paid by the Board until the church pays something on salary; and then the Board, at the same time it pays other missionaries, shall pay to the said Rev. J. M. Smoak an amount not exceeding the amount paid by the said Church, nor exceeding the amount due him at the rate of \$250.00 per annum.

3. That the Board reserve the right to discontinue this aid at any time that it may deem expedient to do so.

Brother Smoak has served the church by giving more than two services per month, by preaching there nearly every Sunday evening.

There are various difficulties connected with the work at the Friendship church. One of the difficulties is a lack of a suitable house of worship. Your Committee therefore take the liberty of recommending that your Executive Committee be requested to give earnest and prayerful consideration to all of the conditions and prospects connected with the work; and if a satisfactory title to a satisfactory site shall be obtained and vested in a satisfactory corporation, or in satisfactory trustees; and if the time shall come that your Committee shall believe, that conditions and prospects will justify an effort to erect a building, then your Committee shall be authorized to do whatever they deem best to aid the church to erect a suitable building. We respectfully recommend further: That if your Executive Committee shall appeal to the churches for aid to erect such a building, that, then, the churches be respectfully urged to respond liberally, to such appeal.
