The Report upon Laymen's Movement was read by F. E. Bell for J. D. Holladay, and adopted.

REPORT ON LAYMEN'S WORK.

From the information we have, we find that the past year has perhaps been the most active and fruitful in all the history of the Laymen's Missionary Movement. A larger number of laymen have been engaged, more or less actively, in the promotion of its policies than ever before. There are laymen who recognize that they are as much responsible for the ongoing of the Kingdom as preachers, secretaries, or college presidents. This is an obligation all laymen should realize.

There is a growing interest among men in religious work. As one evidence of this gratifying situation men are attending religious worship in larger numbers than formerly as is shown by a gain in the male membership of the churches of this country. Another evidence is the fact that large and growing classes of men for the study of God's Word are coming to be the order of the day in connection with the Sunday Schools all over the land.

Another evidence of men's growing regard for Christianity is the fact that thinking people, both Christian and unchristian, are recognizing that religion is a vital factor in the commercial, social and political life of the country.

The matter of chief concern during the past year was the promotion of the stewardship campaign authorized by the Convention at its session in Chattanooga. The general direction of this campaign was entrusted to the executive committee of the Laymen's Missionary Movement. The method of procedure was very similar to that employed in the 75 Million Campaign. This movement called for an extended educational program and the results were necessarily slow at first. However, the results are encouraging. A number of churches have enrolled 50 per cent of the membership, some 80 per cent, and three churches report 100 per cent in writing. Multitudes of business men have been led to adopt this minimum standard.

The work done by the Laymen's Missionary Movement will continue to bear fruit indefinitely, and we feel that this organization will continue to be a moving force for good in the Kingdom of God.

CONSTITUTION.

PREAMBLE.

Whereas several Baptist Churches propose uniting in an Association for the promotion of the Redeemer's Kingdom, by the maintenance of love and fellowship, and by mutual consultation for the peace and welfare of each other, the following articles, therefore are adopted as the written bond of fellowship:

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I. This confederation of Churches shall be known and called by the name of ORANGEBURG BAPTIST ASSOCIATION.

ART. II. The object of this Association shall be to promote the glory of God on earth, by the preaching of the Gospel of his Son, Jesus Christ, our Saviour; the universal spread of the Holy Bible, the Word of the true and living God; and by other appropriate means.

ART. III. This Association shall be composed of Delegates from the Churches of this confederation, their Pastors, and Ordained Ministers who may be members of the same.

ART. IV. Every Church shall be entitled to three delegates, without regard to the number of their members, respectively, and an additional one for every twenty-five members exceeding fifty: Provided, That no Church shall be entitled to more than five lay Delegates.

ART. V. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, who shall be chosen annually, and shall continue in office until a new election shall take place.

ART. VI. The Clerk shall preserve a regular file of the Minutes of the Association from year to year, and have it present at the meetings of the body; and, when he vacates his office, deliver the same, together with all the books and other papers relating to said office, to his successor.

ART. VII. Applications for admission into this Association shall be presented by the delegates bearing such applications, and if, in the judgment of this body, they are orthodox, they shall be received as constituent members thereof.

ART. VIII. As every Church is an independent body, amenable, so far as authority is concerned, to the great Head of the Church alone, yet, while it chooses to continue its connection with this Association, the Association must have the relative right to inquire into its standing, whenever it may be necessary to do so, and, in case of dissatisfaction, to withdraw from it.

ART. IX. In case of internal dissension in a church, and of two parties coming up to the Association, each claiming to represent the Church, neither party shall take a seat until the question is decided which party represents the Church in fellowship with the Association.

ART. X. It shall be the duty of the Association to ascertain the general condition of its constituent Churches, devise means to promote their harmony, and increase their spirituality and efficiency, and to promote the cause of truth and righteousness.

ART. XI. The Association shall hold annual sessions, to convene at such time and place as the Association may select: Pro-

vided. That the Executive Committee shall have the right to change the time and place, or either, when it deems it expedient to do so.

ART. XII. When in session, the Association shall be governed by the usual rules of decorum, and such others as it may adopt for itself.

ART. XIII. The Association earnestly requests the Churches annually to report their general condition, and to furnish information upon subjects requested by the body.

ART. XIV. The neglect or failure of a Church to be represented by a delegate, or delegates, in the Association for three consecutive years, shall be cause to withdraw from such Church at the discretion of the Association.

ART. XV. It shall be the duty of the Committee Upon Nominations to nominate an Executive Committee, consisting of seven brethren, subject to the ratification of the Association.

ART. XVI. Amendments may be made to this Constitution at any regular meeting of the Association, by a vote of two-thirds of the members present and voting.

BY-LAWS.

1. Upon the assembling of the Delegates, immediately after Devotional Service and organizing the Association, a sermon shall be preached. After which, the Moderator may recognize and welcome visitors.

2. The following temporary committees shall then be appointed by the Moderator: 1. Finance; 2. Nominations; 3. Obituaries; 4. Time and Place for Next Meeting. These committees shall make report during the session.

3. The Moderator shall appoint the following Standing Committees: 1. Upon Missions—State, Home, and Foreign; 2. Benevolences—Orphanage, Hospital, and Aged Ministers Relief; 3. Education—Christian and Ministerial; 4. Training Agencies—Sunday Schools, Baptist Young People's Union, Religious Literature, Bible and Colportage; 5. Woman's Work; 6. Public Morals; 7. Digest of Reports. These committees shall make reports of the progress and needs of the work in each respective branch at the succeeding Association.

4. The Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer shall perform the duties usually pertaining to these respective offices.

5. Any of these By-Laws may be altered or amended by a vote of two-thirds of the members present and voting at any meeting of the Association.
