is filed. Applications for admission come almost weekly but must be filed until vacancies occur. Scores of destitute children are waiting their turn to be received. How long will they have to wait? Additional buildings and equipment must be provided if the orphanage is to receive all who apply for admission.

That the hearts of our people are turned toward the Orphanage is evidenced by the fact that during the past year supplies have been received from the churches to the amount of \$11,000.

It is the earnest hope of the trustees that the Orphanage shall be speedily restored to its old place in the Sunday Schools and that "Work Day" be again observed by the schools each year. To this end Pastors and Superintendents are urged to induce their Sunday Schools to make trips to the Orphanage for inspection of its work.

During the past year forty-one children have joined the church of profession of faith. The Orphanage church is in a healthy condition and its work has been greatly blessed.

BAPTIST HOSPITAL.

The property of the Hospital has been recently appraised to be worth \$453,000. The buildings are kept in first class repair by the engineering department of the institution.

A new addition to the Hospital has been completed, containing 48 beds, 13 bath rooms, 6 diet kitchens and a dining room large enough to seat 150.

A Diagnostic Clinic has been established and is provided with all the facilities for thorough diagnostic work at a minimum cost.

The Hospital is especially well equipped to take care of diabetic patients. Training is given the patient to enable him to take care of himself and remain at home.

Since the opening of the hospital 2742 free patients have been cared for. No funds are available for this purpose except fees collected from pay patients. It takes 75 pay patients daily to meet the running expenses of the hospital.

The hospital has been standardized. Recently a representative from the American College of Surgeons checked the institution and declared that all requirements of standardization have been met.

The hospital has thus far received \$116,716.09 from the 75 Million Campaign. It has invested in tangible assets and free work \$37,322.22 over all 75-Million Campaign receipts.

AGED MINISTERS RELIEF.

The work of the Aged Ministers Relief Board for the year 1924 has been kept up to the usual standard of efficiency. No worthy applicant has been turned away, and our beneficiaries are grateful and appreciative in their expressions of thanks for help rendered. We began the year with an enrollment of 94. Have lost seven by death, to date—two have been dismissed by request and four have been received, making our roll number now 92.

The C. C. Brown Memorial Fund, through the bequest of Mrs.

Kate Drafts, Eastover, S. C. has been increased, \$4,871.30, the invested fund now amounting to \$51,000. A legacy of \$500 from the William Tramble Estate, gives the Aged Ministers Relief Board a yearly dividend of interest. Interest on the invested fund is intended to apply on annual insurance premium for the benefit of Baptist Ministers and Foreign Missionaries from S. C. We have an enrollment of 292 ministers and 44 Missionaries in the Group Insurance, whereby every active pastor and employe of a denominational Board—age limit, seventy years—also every Foreign Missionary from S. C., has the privilege of insurance to the extent of \$1500, the pastors paying as part pro rata, 50c for each hundred dollars of salary. Missionaries pay no part premium.

Insurance premium for 1924 amounted to \$10,108.80. Of this amount \$8,672.8 covers insurance of ministers and \$1,433.70, insurance of Foreign Missionaries.
