WEDNESDAY MORNING—FIRST DAY

REPORT ON BENEVOLENCE

The Orphanage

Connie Maxwell Orphanage was established in 1891. The first child was received May 22, 1892. Nearly 2,000 children have been received and cared for. This institution, one among the very best, now has a population of about 300 children. Dr. Jamison, the beloved Superintendent, says: "We could immediately receive many more, but that would call for expenses far beyond current receipts, and they will not allow increase of indebtedness." The money income has been going down steadily, but reduction in number of workers and in number of children has been made to meet shrinkage.

It has been possible to function only because of the success in
