7. Report on Ministerial and Christian Education was read by Rev. Paul A. Bolen. Dr. B. E. Geer and Dr. Carlyle Campbell spoke to the report. The report was adopted.

## CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

There are two imperatives upon us at this time:

1. The denominational college must be "distinctive, or it is doomed." The denominational college has a distinctive task. It is not to be just "another college," it must be a different kind of institution, or it must pass away. The only thing that will justify the outlay of money necessary for its proper maintenance is the peculiar character of its spirit and its work. There is a great field of service open for a real Christian college which sees its task and seeks to perform it faithfully. The Christian college must do a work which others do not undertake and cannot perform.

2. The denominational college must be supported, or it cannot live and function. A Christian college cannot call upon the legislature for large appropriations for its equipment and support. It must be supported by the denomination it serves. It has no other source of support except those who are interested in Christian education. Our Christian colleges need our prayers, our sons and daughters, and our money. Certainly if we do not support them, others will not.

## SOUTH CAROLINA BAPTIST SCHOOLS

South Carolina Baptists have four senior colleges, one junior college, and one academy. They are Furman University and G. W. C. at Greenville, Anderson College at Anderson, Coker at Hartsville, Limestone at Gaffney, and North Greenville Academy at Tigerville.

The increase in the number of students is most heartening. The reports from the five colleges maintained by the denomination in this state show that there were enrolled for the last college year 1,439 students, which number added to the 404 in the summer schools of this year bring the total to 1,843. This registers an increase of 169 over the previous year. We confidently believe that this increase in this period of unprecedented economic depression marks the turn in the tide and that our denominational schools may look forward to continued growth.
